Re: Annual Report 2022

The Board of Directors is very pleased to share this annual report with the Council on the condition of the Seminary, and its own stewardship of the institution.

Reformed Episcopal Seminary awarded four Master of Divinity degrees, a Doctor of Divinity degree, and its first Master of Arts degree this past year. Three of the five Masters' degree recipients are already ordained in an Anglican body and 3 are serving in the Reformed Episcopal Church in an ordained capacity, while another is serving as a layman in the REC. Evidence available to the Board of Directors indicates the educational programs of the seminary continue to achieve the goals established by the Theological Commission of the Reformed Episcopal Church and the Preparation Standards for Seminaries of the Anglican Church in North America. As these expectations form the core of the seminary's mission, the Board of Directors are pleased to report the seminary continues to prepare students faithfully and effectively for Christian ministry, particularly ministry in the Reformed Episcopal Church and other Anglican churches. In the past ten years, the Seminary has produced thirty-four graduates through its Master of Divinity and Master of Arts programs. Eleven of these graduates have been ordained and have served in the Reformed Episcopal Church. Six are currently serving in this Diocese. Three more of these graduates are serving as lay people in the Diocese. Additional graduates have been ordained and have served in other Anglican jurisdictions. Of the fifty students currently enrolled in a program or auditing classes at RE Seminary this year thirty-six are Anglican, including fourteen Reformed Episcopalians.

The Board of Directors expresses its appreciation to the Diocesan Council, the entire denomination, and the many churches and individuals for their continued faithful support for the seminary and the continued recommendation and sponsoring of students. The continued support, prayer, and recruitment of students by the Diocese, the wider REC, and its friends, is essential to the health and maintenance of the seminary and the continued goal to equip leaders for ministry and mission for the Reformed Episcopal Church and the Anglican context and beyond. While the seminary is a distinct organization, it is a ministry and mission of the Reformed Episcopal Church and especially this diocese. It is together, through the grace of God, that we can go forward and do a grand work! Thank you!
