Report of the Committee on Young Peoples Work

I am delighted to report that the Committee on Young People's Work (COYPW) has continued its regular regimen of retreats. Last year, the committee sponsored a week-long summer camp for grades 2-6 and 7-12 (running concurrently) and winter camp on Valentine's weekend for students in middle and high school. All events were held on the grounds of Rock Mountain Bible Camp whose staff has proved, over many years, to be helpful allies in carrying out our programs.

The winter retreat was well-attended by thirty teenagers who were taught by the Very Reverend Jason Holloway. Lessons were centered on the topic "Life from the Wilderness". Over the course of four studies, students examined the role and picture of the wilderness from both testaments, spending time especially on Israel's sojourn and Jesus' fasting. The COYPW thanks Dean Holloway for all of his efforts.

At summer camp, we had the privilege of exploring J.R.R. Tolkien's masterpiece, the Lord of the Rings. Our theme was "the Gospel in Middle Earth". The Reverend Mike Blitz spoke to our older campers. Fr. Mike is very gifted at weaving narration with video clips and did a masterful job presenting a good number of themes. We were also blessed to have the Reverend Jared McNabb speak to our younger students. Jared is a pastor in the CREC, and a long-time friend of Fr. Ricky McCarl, as well as a dear friend to me-albeit for a shorter amount of time. He and his family were a true blessing to our retreat.

In the coming year, we have retreats again planned for Valentine's weekend for middle/high school students (winter camp) and a summer camp planned for grades 2-12 at the end of July. At winter camp, the theme will be "The Greatest of these is Love" and will explore Faith, Hope, and Charity as gifts and virtues. We are still seeking a speaker for this event. We are hoping to explore the book of Job throughout the week.
